As AFC's strategic plan unfolds, and as the impact of our grants program continues to grow, we hope more Canadian Anglicans will seek out AFC support to bring their projects to fruition.

I hope this 2022 Annual Report, and the grant recipient profiles featured in it, will enable you to share in the joy of accomplishment we have experienced this past year. We could not have done it without you.

## **Nurturing the Greater Good: \$280,000 to 49 Applicants**

Churches have deep roots and well-equipped facilities which can function as accessible hubs for a variety of community activities. In 2022, grants for Community Ministries supported churches across Canada in their continued efforts to be catalysts for community-building efforts that benefit a variety of vulnerable populations.



### **Welland Community Breakfast Program Holy Trinity, Welland, ON (Diocese of Niagara)**

In the Diocese of Niagara, a grant for \$15,000 helped the parish of Holy Trinity in Welland, Ontario, expand their community outreach. "We felt we were being invited by God to provide a nourishing, hot breakfast, daily, for our neighbours who are experiencing food insecurity and housing challenges," says Jim Butts, Treasurer and Coordinator of the Community Breakfast Program. "We are uniquely called to come alongside God in this way given our commercial kitchen, our central downtown location, and our stance of empowering and including all who want to join in bringing the fullness of life to our community."



## **An Intentional Community for Youth** **Trinity Anglican Church, Ottawa, ON** **(Diocese of Ottawa)**

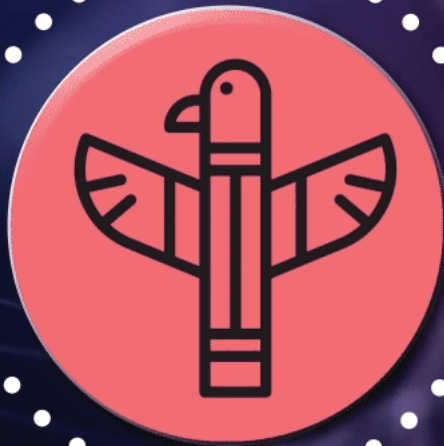
A grant for \$15,000 helped Trinity Anglican Church fund renovations to Trinity House, formerly the Mabel Gordon House. "This innovative project will enable students and young adults to live together within a covenant community, supporting one another in their spiritual growth and in their work or academic life," says the Rt. Rev. Shane Parker, Bishop of Ottawa. "Renovations to the house itself will establish the physical platform for this project by creating spaces that are conducive to living in community. This project is consistent with our Church's ongoing quest to engage with young people in ways that are meaningful, practical and faith-filled. We are grateful to the Foundation: your investment in Trinity House will have a significant impact on its success."



## **Faith and Sharing Retreat** **Faith and Sharing, Comox, BC** **(Diocese of British Columbia)**

"Faith and Sharing's five-day retreat was held from August 21 to 26, 2022 at the Bethlehem Centre in Nanaimo, British Columbia. 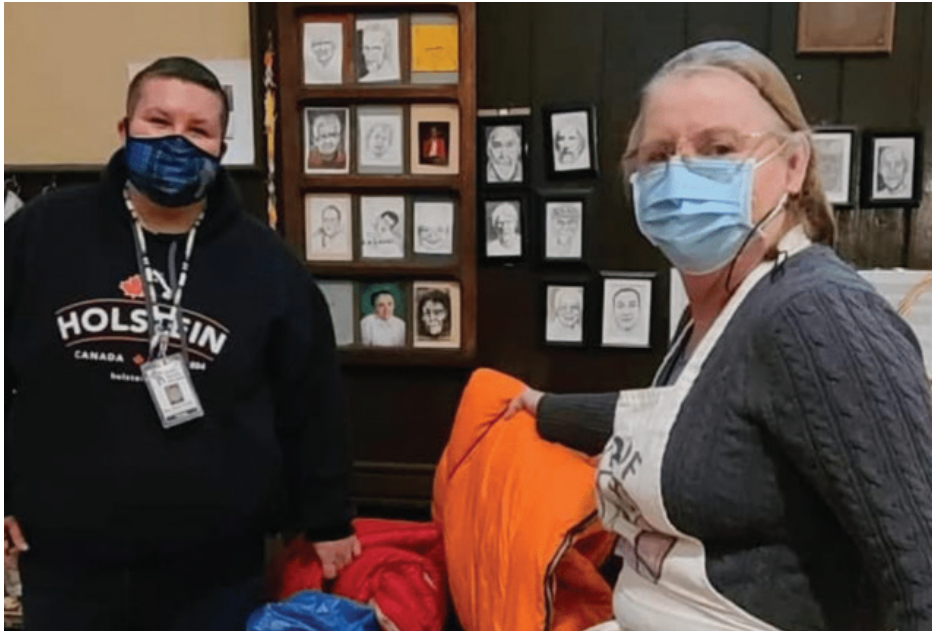


## **Summer Internship Arthur Training Training School, Yellowknife, NT (Diocese of the Arctic)**

In the Diocese of the Arctic, AFC provided a grant for \$8,800 to the Arthur Turner Training School (ATTS) in Yellowknife. "While there is great value in a university-style education, the contextual formation that takes place alongside elders and experienced clergy and lay leaders in the unique communities scattered along the Arctic coast isn't something that can be learned in a classroom," says the Rt. Rev. David Parsons, Bishop of the Arctic. "This funding will allow ATTS to support an Indigenous seminarian to experience life, worship, and ministry in two small towns. This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for a summer internship, and an important milestone in preparing for a long and fruitful ministry."

## **Advancing Reconciliation Efforts: \$216,000 to 22 Recipients**

At AFC, we honour and respect Indigenous ways of being and learning and are committed to the process of healing and reconciliation. In 2022, a Request for Proposals for Indigenous Ministries helped to significantly expand funding for important initiatives in communities across Canada, helping to grow the church's capacity for inclusivity.



## **Lay Pastoral Social Worker Toronto Urban Native Ministry, Toronto, ON (Diocese of Toronto)**

“Pastoral visits to shut-ins and bereaved families; as well as outreach to First Nations women living on streets and shelters, extend a network of care and compassion to Indigenous people who have been marginalized because of the shameful legacy of the residential schools’ era. Weekly worship services share the good news of the Gospel in connection with aboriginal traditions, providing a common point of understanding for Indigenous and non-Indigenous people resolve barriers that have led to exclusion, misunderstanding, and harm. Presentations to Anglican parishes and other denominations help to increase awareness and sensitivity to the concerns of First Nations people. The position of Lay Pastoral Social Worker is essential to all these processes.”

"In the middle of the pandemic whirlwind, AFC bursary support has offered a stillpoint, of sorts, as I transitioned from healthcare chaplaincy into work in the retail services sector, and from ministry within The United Church of Canada through ordination to the transitional diaconate and the Anglican priesthood, rooted at saint benedict's table as part of the Diocese of Rupert's Land. As COVID-19 brought recurrent waves, I took a course through Vancouver School of Theology's Summer Institute, "Theologizing in the Time of COVID: Revelations from The Plague." I adapted the major paper I wrote for that course as springboard for a presentation – "From COVID-19 to Climate Change: Engaging Lived and Living Theologies When 'The Old Gray Mare, She Ain't What She Used To Be'" – at last year's VST Inter-Religious Conference, "Religious Responses to Climate Change."

## **Growing Community and Connection: \$400,000 to 25 Recipients**

Refreshed signage, accessible washrooms, restored pillars and towers, new floors, new roofs, new windows, and new carpets. This is the blizzard of activity spurred on by AFC's 2022 Diverse Infrastructure grants. The variety of projects funded revealed a church determined to emerge from the pandemic, ready to grow community and connection.



### **Growing Urban Connections St. Luke's Anglican Church, Edmonton, AB (Diocese of Edmonton)**

At St. Luke's in Edmonton, a \$15,000 grant in support of a pillar repair project will help the church to overcome structural challenges so that it can continue to be a beacon of hope for people in downtown Edmonton. "The ministry of St. Luke's has focused on connections within our urban neighbourhood," says the Rev. Nick Trussell, Rector. St. Luke's is host to the Edmonton Food Bank, three 12-step groups, two Christian communities, two community choirs, and a dance group. "We are grateful to AFC. Without this repair the building would no longer be safe for our community to use."



## **New Washroom**

### **St. Mary's Anglican Church, Clarenville, NL** **(Diocese of Central Newfoundland)**

St. Mary's Anglican Church in Clarenville, NL received a grant for \$8,600 to support the renovation of the washroom. "The leadership of St. Mary's Church have been diligent in their study of sustainable and intentionally missional ministries. Part of their work is centred around infrastructure, and how the church building can best welcome and serve people. In short, they have seen the wisdom in installing a washroom facility on the main floor of the nave, and other upgrades. The focus of this work is to provide a benefit of comfort and safety for every generation." The Rt. Rev. John Watton, Bishop of Central NFLD.



## **It's Not Easy Being Green**

### **St. Stephen the Martyr, Burnaby, BC** **(Diocese of New Westminster)**

"In 1913 when the Church was built there was bare property all around us, dirt roads and horse and carriages. Today in 2022 we are surrounded by high-rise apartments, a large mall, paved roads, and cars. We are hoping with the upgrades on the Church will attract more parishioners and have an impact on the neighbourhood to say, 'We are here and we are green.' The mammoth task of repainting the whole outside of the Church and changing the colour from brown to green has given us a whole new look. The task of repainting was a huge financial cost and without the support of AFC, the Diocese of New Westminster, and members of our parish this would not have been possible."

## Partnership Appeal for Youth Ministry: \$160,000 to 22 Partners

AFC's 2022 Say Yes! to Kids (SYTK) campaign was a great success, with 22 fundraising teams in 13 dioceses having secured more than \$160,000 in funding. The first-ever partnership appeal model enabled two thirds of the STTK teams to reach or surpass their goals, and the remaining third achieved between 50% and 80% of their targets.



### Indigenous Youth Participation General Synod of the Anglican Church of Canada

In September 2022, AFC announced a grant of \$25,000 from the national proceeds of the 2022 Say Yes! to Kids campaign in support of the Canadian Lutheran Anglican Youth (CLAY) August 2023 gathering in Waterloo, Ont. According to Sheilagh McGlynn, Animator, Youth Ministries, General Synod of the Anglican Church of Canada, "Past experience has shown that many Indigenous communities struggle financially to send delegates to CLAY. This means that for too many years, Indigenous youth have missed out on this critical connection-building opportunity." McGlynn says: "The Planning Committee is grateful for this funding which gives them the power to begin to reduce financial barriers for Indigenous youth and to make CLAY a much more inclusive event."



## **Revitalizing Arctic Youth Nation**

### **Anglican Diocese of the Arctic**

The Diocese of the Arctic has emerged from the COVID-19 pandemic filled with hope and purpose and will use the nearly \$15,000 raised through the 2022 SYTK campaign to support the work of the Diocesan Youth Coordinator. This individual will take a St. Paul approach: embedded in a community for 2-3 months at a time to launch and shepherd programs, while equipping local people to keep those programs running. The Diocese is committed to creating safe spaces for young men and women to gather and hear of the love and mercy found in Christ, and to responding to the crisis of youth suicide by growing a climate of hope: letting young people know that God has a plan for them and will guide, restore, and bless them.



## **Bursaries for Indigenous Students**

### **St. Paul's Anglican Church, Thunder Bay, ON (Diocese of Algoma)**

The more than \$8,300 raised through St. Paul's 2022 SYTK campaign was designated to support Indigenous students pursuing post-secondary education. The church's Mini-Camino pilgrimage effort provided bursaries for Indigenous students to ease the financial burden of their learning journey. "Through this effort we did so much more than raise money," says the Ven. Deborah Kraft. "We showed the Indigenous students of Thunder Bay that we were willing to make them a priority and to do our part to help close the education gap between Indigenous and non-Indigenous students."

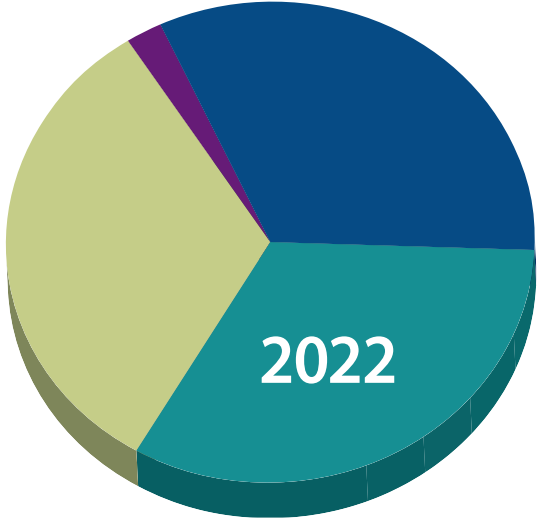
## Stewarding a bright and prosperous future

2022 was a strong fundraising year for the Foundation with over \$872,864 received in bequests, gifts, and annual contributions. Our revenues were impacted by negative investment income of \$920,538 representing an unrealized loss on our investments at December 31, 2022. Inflation, Russia's invasion of Ukraine, and rising interest rates, all led the headlines in 2022 with stock and bond markets ending the year in the red. With our long-term investment approach and continued focus on growing fundraising revenues, we were able to once again disburse over \$1,000,000.

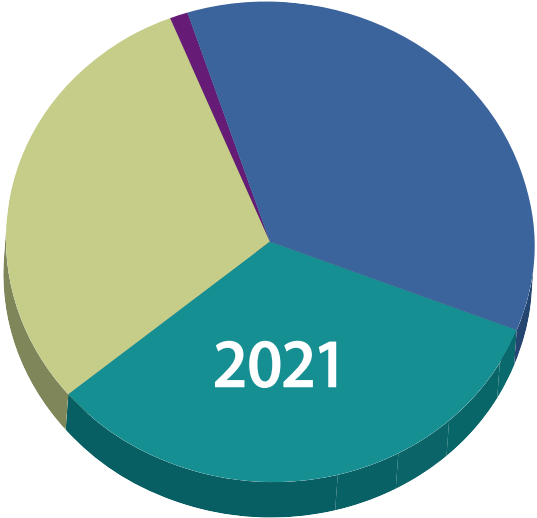
